Under the leadership of Bill Sr.'s sons, Bill Jr. and Chris, Ashland Addison Florist developed a web presence (www.ashaddflorist.com) and added an 11,500-square-foot design, shipping and receiving facility that has since relocated to 1956 W. 17th St. Bill Jr. has since retired to Arizona, but his son Justin Sheffield — the fourth generation Sheffield to lead the company — is currently co-owner along with Chris, whose wife, Holly, works in the company's accounting department.

As Ashland Addison leadership has changed, what has remained consistent for almost a century is the Sheffield family priding itself on quality, creative artistry, unwavering dependability, and the warmest customer service, ensuring its customers' special occasions are filled with timeless beauty and heartfelt sincerity. Since remaking the "old storefront into a unique space for bicycle retail and repair" with friends and family, the longtime Roscoe Village residents have built Roscoe Village Bikes into a full-service bike shop — among the services they offer include assembling all new bikes, working on e-bikes, repairing strollers and wheelchairs, and providing onsite repair services and workshops.
