PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Miami Public Schools has undergone a significant transformation in recent years, marked by a series of dynamic changes. Headlines have been dominated by the ongoing impacts of Covid-19, various construction projects, and the evolving landscape of Oklahoma's education funding plans.

In 2019, a pivotal moment arrived when voters in the Miami Public School district approved a proposition, granting administrators the authority to issue bonds exceeding \$19 million. This financial backing was earmarked to revitalize school buildings and enhance overall school facilities.

Fast forward four-plus years, and the construction phase within Miami Public Schools is either complete or nearing its conclusion. The fruition of this effort resulted in the establishment of the newly built Miami High School and the converted old high school to house the Miami Jr. High School in 2021,

accompanied by the strategic consolidation of other schools.

The momentum continued into 2023 with the commencement of construction for the district's new Central Office and additional facilities at the high school/junior high school's shared Secondary Education site. This expansion included new classrooms, locker rooms, a weight room, and accessible entrances. The Central Office project reached completion in 2023, setting the stage for a transformative educational landscape. Meanwhile, the Miami High School/Jr. High School project is anticipated to conclude in early 2024.

This era of change within Miami Public Schools signifies a commitment to providing modern, state-of-the-art facilities for students, ensuring an environment conducive to academic excellence and overall growth.

Other communities in Ottawa County boast great school districts. Although each has smaller student populations than Miami, they each have a profound impact on their students and community.

NORTHEAST TECH

Northeast Tech's Afton campus is one of four campuses offering full-time courses for adults and high school students. It is accredited by the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education. More than 1,200 students participate each year in programs ranging from auto collision to cosmetology. High school juniors and seniors, who receive free tuition, can attend Monday through Friday during the morning or afternoon sessions. There is also a 13th Year Scholarship that covers eligible students' tuition during the year following high school graduation.

NEO A&M COLLEGE
